E) **Update on Tsunami Resilience Project**

Scott Fregonese, City Planner, gave a Power Point presentation updating the Commission on the scope of the Tsunami Resilience Project and the progress they have made so far. He stated that once all of the policies had been reviewed it would be brought back to the Planning Commission. Daugherty asked if Fregonese had decided what other cities he would like to look at and possibly mirror. Meg Reed suggested mirroring Coos County. Fregonese also discussed relocating critical services. He said that Greenwood Resources had 13 acres at the North end of North 3rd Ave. that would allow the police and fire to move to higher ground. He stated that annexation and zone changes would be necessary and it would need to be moved into City limits. He said he would like to include the recommendation in the resiliency plan. Baumgart stated that the only resistance previously to moving the critical services was increased traffic on North 3rd Ave. Daugherty brought up problems with the fire

trucks turning tight enough for the intersection. Fregonese stated that there was a plan to redesign the intersection from N. 3rd and Hwy. 101 to N. Coral St. McIntire stated that there needed to be a method to incorporate all requirements from ADA, ODOT and the City. Halvorsen asked what was entailed in changing the zone. Fregonese discussed the process which would include annexation and negotiating with the County. McIntire asked about the property being timberland. Fregonese did not think there would be any mitigation since it was no longer forest land.

F) Recommended Code Changes of Flood Hazard Overlay Zone

Fregonese stated that, included in Commission packets, were the recommended changes to the Flood Hazard Overlay Zone that must be adopted prior to FEMA's adoption of the new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) in September 2018. He explained that the new maps were done in 2014, but not approved. Fregonese stated he had briefed the City Council and told them he would bring it back to them after presenting it to the Planning Commission. He said there would be the addition of some language suggested by David Lentzner, DLCD. McGinnis asked about a statement in the new language which talked about a 1' height change. Fregonese stated he would verify this change. Baumgart made a motion, seconded by McGinnis to move the recommendations onto the City Council for adoption of code changes to the Flood Hazard Overlay Zone with any changes Fregonese might suggest, motion carried.

Fregonese stated that he had presented the idea of a downtown improvement plan to the Council and they agreed. He also mentioned the N 3rd concepts and Luke Shepard had asked for him to bring in an example of what it might look like with the curbs, trees, lights, etc.
