Mobile Equipment Capital Replacement Plan

- 2023-2024 Purchase a Quint to replace 2013
- Cost is \$1,000,000
- This acquisition is the highest priority of the fire department



Mobile Equipment Capital Replacement Plan

- 2024-2025 Replace rescue and brush engines with one vehicle
- This is the second highest priority of the fire department
- Cost is \$400,000



Mobile Equipment Capital Replacement Plan

- 2025-2026 Replace rescue and brush engines with one vehicle
- This is the Third highest priority of the fire department
- Cost is \$500,000



Mobile Equipment Capital Replacement Plan

- Equipment will be financed through a lease to own program
- Items will be purchased by priority
- Total Project cost is \$1,900,000
- Purchasing will be completed as funding is available
- \$300,000 has been appropriated in the 2023-2024 draft budget

- Thermal imaging camera

- \$35,000

- Storage Shed \$12,500
- Total current project cost \$200,000

Acquisition will be obtained by priority and funding availability



\$75,000 has been appropriated in the draft budget for 2023-2024
