- 2024-2025 Replace rescue and brush engines with one vehicle
- This is the second highest priority of the fire department
- Cost is \$400,000



- 2025-2026 Replace rescue and brush engines with one vehicle
- This is the Third highest priority of the fire department
- Cost is \$500,000




- Equipment will be financed through a lease to own program

- Purchasing will be completed as funding is available
- \$300,000 has been appropriated in the 2023-2024 draft budget

City leadership wants to hear from residents, nearby community members, and Neah-Kah-Nie High and Middle School students, staff, and parents before technical design is underway.


The project team is hosting a series of community workshops and listening sessions. The first next session is scheduled for May 17, 2023.

Fireworks in Rockaway Beach

City Ordinances

- WEAPONS AND FIREWORKS

CHAPTER 95: NOISE

• 95.07 EXEMPTIONS

- (K) Noise emanating from the combustion, detonation, or concussion caused by using fireworks or other similar devices, from July 1 until July 5 of each year.
- 95.99 PENALTIES (A) A person who violates a provision of this chapter is guilty of an infraction, which is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$250.

CHAPTER 90: GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 90.02 (E) Sale of fireworks. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell fireworks within the City of Rockaway Beach until he or she has received a permit from the Oregon State Fire Marshal and have provided the city with a copy of the permit.
- 90.02 (F) Use of fireworks. It shall be unlawful for any person to shoot or discharge fireworks within the City of Rockaway Beach
- 10.99 GENERAL PENALTY (A) Any person violating any provision of this code for which no other specific penalty is provided shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500

WEAPONS AND FIREWORKS

- 131.040 DISCHARGE OF WEAPON; WEAPON DISCHARGE PERMIT
 - (A) No person shall fire or discharge a weapon within the corporate limits of the city or within land owned or controlled by the city.
 - (B) Weapon means any instrument capable of causing serious physical injury, damage or death to a person or to property Weapon includes fireworks meeting the above definition, including Chinese or other uncontrolled, lighter than air lanterns propelled by a candle or other source of combustion,
 - 10.99 GENERAL PENALTY (A) Any person violating any provision of this code for which no other specific penalty is provided shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500
