Rockaway Beach's Ultimate September Bucket List

Dungeness crabs come into season and the Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad goes leaf peeping.

The Oregon coast's Rockaway Beach—a tiny gem of a town set on a seven-mile shoreline boasts an extended summer chock full of ways to spend a relaxing weekend in touch with nature. From eclectic shopping that reads more like a treasure hunt among antique outposts and pastel-colored snack shops to museums chronicling the region's history on land, water, and sky, year-round attractions are easy to come by.

But September brings can't-miss bucket list items of its own. Never fear, we've compiled the best of the best.



Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad

A red caboose acts as sentry guarding the Rockaway Beach depot of the Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad. Aboard the early 20th-century locomotives—one of which may look familiar from its cameo in the 1986 *Stand By Me* film—riders learn the history of the natural areas passing by the restored car windows. The Railroad's annual Fall Splendor Excursion returns to the tracks in late September. The route traverses coastal forests alive with fall colors in a 45-minute ride from Rockaway to Wheeler where passengers explore the tiny town before returning to the Rockaway depot.



Cedar Wetlands Nature Preserve

The town's nature preserve boasts a rare find: a giant, old-growth western red cedar spared from logging. A one-mile hiking trail through the urban cedar bog carts visitors to the behemoth: a trunk 154 feet tall and 49 feet wide. The unique trail is built exclusively of boardwalks set above the forest floor, rendering the entire mud-free jaunt accessible by wheelchairs and strollers.



Fat Tire Beach Biking

To risk stating the obvious, Rockaway Beach's shoreline shouldn't be overlooked. A calling card of the town's seven miles of sand along the Pacific Coast, the arched Twin Rocks formation stands just offshore as a dramatic point of interest. On shore, low tide brings rockhounding and tidepooling for sharp eyes. Bikes with oversized tires make for easy beach transport, and Troxel's Rock Garden in town rents the special cycles and offers free beach-ready wheelchairs to traverse the expansive stretch.

Kelly's Brighton Marina Crabbing and Jetty Fishery Clamming

The guides at Kelly's Brighton Marina turn seafaring novices into accomplished folks eating fresh-caught crab by the onsite fire pit. They'll bait crab rings, teach techniques, and cook your catch. Dungeness crab and their sweet, buttery flavor populate the waters around the marina, and September through December is peak crab-catching season in Nehalem Bay. Nearby Jetty Fishery arms clammers with rental clam guns, shovels, rakes, buckets, and shellfish licenses. Purple varnish and Eastern soft shell clams call Nehalem Bay home, but venturing further north garners razor clams.

Garibaldi Seafood and Spirits Festival

Rockaway Beach's coastal neighbor, just five miles south, hosts an annual seafood bash to celebrate the nosh both towns harvest from the sea. Local oysters, seaweed, and mussels headline Garibaldi's fest—and a plethora of local brewers and distillers share the spotlight. After palates are placated, visitors can shop seafood-centric vendors' art and wares, take in live music, and learn a thing or two from cooking demonstrations. Share

With lots of lodging options and restaurants, Rockaway Beach is the ideal home base to make great memories or start new traditions. Outdoors or in, here's a list of things to do in and near Rockaway Beach this fall.

Old Growth Cedar Wetlands Trail

The oldest resident in Rockaway Beach is a mammoth Western Red Cedar, at an estimate of 900 years. At 49 feet in circumference, it is also among Oregon's largest trees. Visit this grande dame, which has survived earthquakes, fires, tsunamis, and development, by walking the raised boardwalk through the wetlands preserve. Informative signage posted along the ADA-friendly walk shares stories of trees, wildlife, and stewardship. Located at the south end of Rockaway Beach at Highway 101 and Washington Street.

Coast Scenic Railroad, pulled by a vintage steam engine, offers tours between Rockaway

International Deline Monal

A former police chief of Rockaway Beach had over the years collected police memorabilia from around the U.S. and other countries. This unique museum is interactive and educational, and the collection changes regularly. Stop in for fun at 320 Highway 101 in downtown Rockaway Beach.

Ride the Bails

Embark on the trip reminiscent of yesteryear. The Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad, pulled by a vintage steam engine,



offers terrific tours in fall and hosts the Candy Cane Express between Thanksgiving and Christmas. The train whistle makes everyone smile. Get your tickets at:

Rock Garden Mini Golf

This fantastical. colorful mini golf course is built on a Wizard of Oz theme, and it's nothing like Kansas. Get your club and golf balls and have fun navigating Oz. Located in the center of town, you can't miss it. The bubble machine is a quick giveaway to its location. And if you're up for a bike ride on the beach, you can rent bikes for adults and kids, all thanks to Troxel's', the store right next door.

Rockhounding

See all the people on the beach with their eyes locked on the sand as they walk? Chances are they are hunting for agates and shells, which Rockaway Beach has a bounty of. The surf brings treasures ashore – you'll find them at low tides. Oregon's north coast is a seafood destination, whether you want to order it in a restaurant, or dig and fish for your dinner. Just a few miles north of Rockaway Beach is Kelly's Marina and Jetty Fishery, where you can learn to catch and cook Dungeness crab. Or go just south of town to Garibaldi, where you can catch crab or dig for clams at low tide in Tillamook Bay. If fishing is on your wish list, cast a line from the fishing dock at Lake Lytle or the beach, or hire a guide.
