Oregon legislature determines SSF amounts each legislative session

Funds allocated to all but four districts in Oregon:

- Jewell
- Neah-Kah-Nie
- Nestucca
- Seaside

Exempt from SSF due to:

- Property assessment values
- Timber





Annually, foresters determine the amount of timber areas to be sold and harvested.

Companies "lay claim" to an area and can harvest within a three year period.


Once harvested, funds are distributed:

- Tillamook County 10%
- County School Fund 22.5%
 - Divided among three school districts
- Direct to Taxing Districts 67.5%
 - Divided among schools, ports, fire, etc.

Staff or Program Cuts

If revenue stays at current levels, 20.5 staff members will need to be cut.

Timber funds are decreasing before the Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) is in full effect

If revenue continues to decrease, programs could be at risk

Bonds & Levies



Construction Bond

- Bonds pay for capital construction projects and other infrastructure, like technology and buses.
- By Oregon law, bond money cannot pay for teaching positions or school programs.
- In 2004, NKN voters passed a bond to pay for the construction of the middle school and other projects.


Operation Levy



- Levies are used to help pay for the day-to-day operations of a school district.
- Levies can pay for staff, programs and services that are either not funded or are not fully funded by the state of Oregon.
- If the proposed levy passes, 100% of the funds would be used to pay for teacher and staff salaries and student programs in the district.
- Bonds & Levies are based off Assessed Property Value

May 2025 Ballot Measure



- Currently, residents are paying \$0.487 per \$1,000 of assessed property value for the 2004 middle school bond.
- This bond expires this year.

- The current ballot measure is for an Operation Levy of \$0.75 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.
- This would be a \$0.263 per \$1,000 increase from what residents currently pay



- Because the 2004 bond is expiring this year...
- If the levy passes: a homeowner with an assessed property value of \$250,000 would pay \$5.50 more per month, or \$66 more per year, than they are currently paying.

How does this affect my tax bill?

Levy Revenue



- If the levy passes, NKN will receive:
 - \$2,080,000 in 25-26
 - \$2,140,000 in 26-27
 - \$2,210,000 in 27-28
 - \$2,270,000 in 28-29
 - > \$2,340,000 in 29-30
- These funds will allow us to maintain current staffing levels and student programing
- Allow the district to evaluate long term impacts of the HCP on timber revenue.



 60% of assessed properties within the Neah-Kah-Nie School District are owned by people not residing in the district.

 The largest burden of the levy will be paid for by those with second homes or short-term rentals within our district.

Second Home Owners





- In 2004, the Middle School bond was sold to voters at \$0.94 per \$1000.
- The highest rate the district ever levied was \$0.7038 per \$1000
- Currently, the rate is \$0.487.
- The district has a history of not collecting more than is needed from taxpayers.
- The NKN School Board has been a great steward of the public's money.



Subject: Review of Small Community Grant Award Recommendations

ISSUE STATEMENT

The City Council will consider approving Small Community Grant Awards by Resolution at the regular meeting. The Small Community Grant applications and proposed Resolution to award grants are included in the agenda packet for the Council's review.

BACKGROUND

The Council appropriated \$75,000 for the Community Grant Program in the 2024-2025 fiscal year adopted budget. The Small Community Grant provides funding to non-profit, not-for-profit organizations and community entities that serve the Rockaway Beach community in the amount of \$4,999.99 or less. The Planning Commission has reviewed applications based on established grant evaluation criteria and has made funding recommendations to the City Council. A total of six applications were received and all were recommended for funding, totaling \$22,773.58.

Planning Commission Recommendations:

At their March 20, 2025 regular meeting, the Planning Commission recommend that the City Council award Small Community Grants in the dollar amounts and subject to the conditions indicated below:

Tillamook County Developmental Disabilities: \$1,000

Rockaway Beach Business Association: \$4,999

Friends of Rockaway Beach Library: \$1,864

North Coast Communities for Watershed Protection (NCCWP): \$4,980 subject to the agreement that to not spend the funds for administration purposes.

Neah-Kah-Nie Coast Arts Music & Cultural Foundation (NCAM): \$4,999

International Police Museum: \$4,931.58; subject to the agreement that the meeting room will be made available to all community members on the same basis.

Both NCCWP and NCAM have met conditions by providing written agreement (attached).

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF ROCKAWAY BEACH TO APPLY FOR A FUNDING PACKAGE FROM THE CLEAN WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN THE APPLICATION

WHEREAS, since 2023, the City has been actively engaged in developing approaches to bring the portions of the Jetty Creek watershed into City ownership, including the development of a Letter of Intent between the City and Nuveen Natural Capital (Nuveen) identifying a target acquisition deadline of December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the City has engaged with Sustainable Northwest and worked with partners to secure a multi-part funding package to meet the acquisition deadline for the Lower Jetty Creek Watershed; and

WHEREAS, the City's application for the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board's (OWEB) Drinking Water Source Protection Grant Program for \$1.4 million has been recommended for funding by the OWEB review committee, and

WHEREAS, the City's application of \$3.75 million to the Oregon Department of Forestry's (ODFW) Federal Forest Legacy Program was approved by ODFW and submitted for Federal review, and

WHEREAS, the Oregon Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) program presents an opportunity to help ensure necessary funds are available and will eliminate the risk of funding gaps due to timing and grant process requirements; and

WHEREAS, CWSRF is a low interest loan program that offers partial loan forgiveness of up to \$2 million; and

WHEREAS, the City can reduce their funding request or withdraw their CWSRF application at any point during the process.

NOW THEREFORE. THE CITY OF ROCKAWAY BEACH RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Rockaway Beach City Council hereby authorizes the submission of an application to Oregon's Department of Environmental Quality for the Clean Water State Revolving Loan Program for up to \$5 million in funding, and authorizes the City Manager to sign the application.
