City Manager's Update

As we head into another busy summer, I want to share all the exciting progress happening in Rockaway Beach. As always, thank you for the opportunity to continue to serve the Rockaway Beach community. – City Manager, Luke Shepard.

2025/2026 City of Rockaway Beach Budget is Approved

City Council has approved the 2025/2026 Budget at

their May 14th council meeting. An incredible amount of work goes into finalizing a budget for a city that has as many projects and events as Rockaway Beach. The \$35 million budget was built to align the city's resources with the goals set in our five-year Strategic Plan. Many thanks to the city's finance director, Marni Johnston, and the entire budget committee members for their dedication to the process. The new budget will roll out July 1, 2025.



The OWEB Board voted unanimously to award the City of Rockaway Beach \$1,422,270.00 for the Jetty Creek acquisition project. This is the city's 3rd grant received for this project. The final draft of the new Source Water Protection Plan was approved by the City Council in May, and is now on its way to the Oregon Health Authority for review. Next up is the development of a Forest Stewardship Plan, and a land valuation appraisal for the lower half of the watershed. These actions will set the stage for a potential acquisition in late 2026.

4th of July Events

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Short-Term Rental Renewals

Renewal Period Is Now Open

- All STR owners must have access to a valid email account to complete the renewal process.
- Renewals must be completed in one session. You will not be able to save your progress and return later.
- Renewal applications and payments will be completed online.
- Certificates will be emailed to STR owners for printing.
- Completed online application and payment must be received no later than July 31, 2025 or the STR license will expire.

You will need the following documents for upload in PDF or image format to complete the renewal process:

- 1. Image of house or address identifier that is visible from the street (image taken from the street).
- 2. Image of required identification sign posted on property and visible from the street (image taken from the street).
- Close up image of identification sign including an email address and a contact telephone number for the owner or local agent.
- 4. Parking plan map and notice posted in a conspicuous place within the rental unit identifying the number and location of off-street parking for renters.
- 5. Proof of active liability insurance coverage from your insurance company.



Streets Resurfacing Projects

As part of the City Streets Capital Improvement Plan, Rockaway Beach completed three street-maintenance projects in May. You may have noticed crews working on Sections of N. Miller St., S. Anchor St., and N. Third Ave., recently. These projects extend the life of our roads by adding a protective wear surface layer which seals the asphalt to prevent early deterioration. You may notice sand in the completed project areas which is normal and should be expected. Thank you for your patience during the work period. Public Works is now finalizing plans for major road and utility work on N. Pacific St. Stay tuned for more information to come.

Fire Department

EMT Class and EMT Advanced class-

The EMT class is nearing completion. Eighteen students are attending from throughout Tillamook and Lincoln Counties. Following the completion of the EMT class, the Fire Department will be hosting an EMT-Advanced class. This class will teach and certify students to start IV's and administer some medications, as well as improve patient assessment skills.

Drone Program-

The Drone program continues to improve. The team has spent many hours improving skills and abilities. Mapping the beach to keep track of riptides, and use of our thermal imaging camera have been the highlights of recent training.

Emergency Management-

The June 4th Emergency Preparedness class will be on Wildfire Safety. Chief Hesse will be presenting. The class will cover Defensible Space, Safety Tips, and how to be prepared in case of wildfire.

Ladder Truck Update-



The ladder truck build continues. The ladder is in the final stages of construction; the pump has been installed and is just waiting for the final touches. We are anticipating a late June delivery. The Fire Department will then outfit and train with the ladder, and anticipate placing the truck in service in August.

Public Works

Slurry Seal Project - May 20-21

As part of the City Streets Capital Improvement Plan, Rockaway Beach underwent a slurry seal treatment on selected streets. This project helps extend the life of our roads by adding a protective wear surface and sealing the asphalt to prevent early deterioration. The roadway will be sandy following the application. Thanks to the community for your patience during the treatment.









Pacific Street Improvements - Grant Funded

We are excited to announce that Rockaway Beach has received a \$250,000 Small City Allotment (SCA) grant for the improvement of N. Pacific Street from N. 4th to N. 9th. The project will include comprehensive upgrades to sewer, water main, stormwater systems, and roadway paving. Stay tuned for updates as the project advances.

NKN Street Light Project - Completed

Thanks to a successful partnership between the city, Neah-Kah-Nie High School, and the Tillamook PUD, new streetlights have been installed on **Highway 101 in front of the high school**. This enhancement improves both student and driver safety. A big thank you to the community members and organizations that helped bring this project to completion!

Leak Detection Project - Progress Update

The City has applied for a **\$20,000 Leak Detection Study** under the Sustainable Infrastructure Planning Project program. The **Oregon Health Authority (OHA)** has reviewed our application, and we're proud to report the project has been added to the **Project Priority List** and recommended for funding. This study is a key step in identifying and reducing water system loss.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

As part of the city's Master Plan, both the primary sludge pump and the trickling filter recirculation pump are being replaced. The project has been approved and awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. These upgrades will improve system efficiency and reliability.
